

FUN FACTS

Birds of prey can be divided into two groups. The first group is diurnal birds: these birds are the ones which are more active during the daytime and includes hawks, eagles, vultures and falcons. The second group is nocturnal birds: these are the birds which are more active during the night and includes owls.
